DEFINITION: WHO

HEALTH

- absence of disease
- physical, intellectual, psycho-social, spiritual well-being

*“...extent to which an individual or group is able to **realize aspirations and satisfy needs**, and to **change or cope with the environment**. Health is a **resource for everyday life**, not the objective of living; it is a positive concept, emphasizing social and personal resources as well as physical capabilities.”*

DEFINITION: WHO

PUBLIC HEALTH

- concerns the “public”
- operates in an increasingly complex and rapidly changing landscape
- extend into other sectors that influence health opportunities and outcomes

QUESTIONS

- What predicts our ability to stay healthy and live a quality life?
- Where do health differences among social groups originate, if we trace them back to their deepest roots?
- What pathways lead from root causes to the stark differences in health status observed at the population level?
- Which intermediary factor plays an overwhelmingly influential role in our health?
